- CML Annual Conference in Vail. CML's Annual meeting always abuts APPA on the calendar. Figuring I'd see what a day in the life of Rick Rigel must feel like, I literally flew from New Orleans to Denver, drove home, and woke up and drove up to the CML conference in Vail (the two-hour ground stop in New Orleans due to the storms in Denver was a real treat!).
